Name of Scholarship	Amount	Criteria
Annieville Elementary -	\$300	Awarded to a graduate of Annieville Elementary who demonstrates a positive attitude, good community spirit and is entering into a Post-Secondary program in the Fall of graduation year.
Artona	\$625	Awarded to a graduate who has shown excellence in the visual arts.
Canadian Federation of University Women -	\$600 (approx)	Graduating female continuing education at a post- secondary institution in the year of graduation. Minimum B average; demonstrated involvement in school or community activities. Financial need is a requirement. Recipients of major awards not eligible. Confirmation of registration in university or university transfer program required.

Delta Principals & Vice Principals Association DPVA	\$750x1	This award recognizes a deserving ,graduating student who has post-secondary goals. Selection criteria include the student's need, leadership, and citizenship.
CUPE 1091 (supplemental application required) -	\$500	Children or grandchildren of members of Local 1091, who are going on to post-secondary education, will be eligible to apply for this scholarship. The Scholarship Committee of each school shall choose the recipient.
Delta International Students Program & Me- Guard Insurance	\$500x1	Top International Student as determined by International Coordinator at Delview in consultation with ISP and Delview Staff. A student, preferably graduating, with strong academic standing and also school involvement.
Delta Firefighters Charitable Society -	\$500	Awarded to a graduate continuing their post-secondary education in mechanical or trades.
Delta Teachers Association -	\$1200x1	This award recognizes graduating students with high academic or vocational standing, who are planning to continue their education at a post-secondary institution, preferably in teacher training.
DYSL -	\$2500 x 6	Awarded to a student who has displayed personal growth, not necessarily high academic achievement, financial need, self-motivated and volunteerism.

Delview Fine and Performing Arts -	\$ 300	DO NOT APPLY. The Delview Fine and Performing Arts Department will award this to students who have excelled in the areas of fine arts, drama, music, or photography.
Delview PAC -	\$500 x 2	Awarded to a highly motivated grade 12 student, who doesn't necessarily have the best GPA, but maintains a positive attitude and a great work ethic.
Delview Staff Scholarship -	\$300	Awarded to a graduating student who has applied to a post-secondary program and can demonstrate the most improved grade point average in Grade 11 and 12.
Devon Gardens -	\$250	Awarded to a former Devon Gardens student who completed Grade 7 at Devon Gardens. The scholarship is to be applied to tuition for a recognized post- secondary institution. The student should have exhibited good character in his or her studies while attending Devon Gardens.
 Forte Physiotherapy -	\$250	Awarded to a student accepted into a university or college with a Science/Health focus (progams can include kinesiology, human kinetics, nursing, dietition, etc.), who also participates in a community or school sport.
FutureBook Yearbooks -	\$1000 or 2 x \$500	DO NOT APPLY . The Media Arts teacher will award this to yearbook students who have demonstrated an exemplary commitment level to this year's publication. The recipient will be an individual who has held an integral role in the publication of this year's book, with outstanding results.
Gibson Elementary -	\$250	Awarded to a well-rounded graduate of Gibson Elementary who continued to help at Gibson after having left.

Homelife Benchmark -	\$300	For a deserving student enrolled in a post-secondary business program.
Laura Szendrei Memorial -	\$250x1	Awarded to a well-rounded student who is involved in sports, and has demonstrated volunteerism or community service.
Mahli Family Bursary -	\$250x1	Awarded to a deserving student based on financial need, community/school service and good academic standing.
Tarlochan Singh Pooni Memorial Award	\$ 500x1	Awarded to a deserving student based on financial need, community/school service and good academic standing.
Mroke Memorial Award (Kuldip Mroke)	\$750 x 2	Awarded to a student that demonstrates financial need and is intending to study in the field of trades.
Melissa Stathers Bursary	\$1,000x1	This bursary is in honour of Ms. Melissa Stathers, a much-loved teacher, coach and colleague who tragically passed away in a car accident in May of 2022. Awarded to a student who possesses qualities which were important to Ms. Stathers such as education, sports, leadership and compassion for others. Special consideration for this bursary will be given to a student pursuing a career in teaching. In a less than 300 words, applicants are asked to share their passion for leadership, education and sports, along with name/contact for two teacher references
North Delta Lions Club -	\$1,000	Awarded to a graduate continuing their post-secondary education, minimum B average, demonstrated involvement in school or community activities. Financial needs may be a consideration.
North Delta Minor Hockey Association	\$750	Awarded to a graduate who has played at least 5 years of hockey with ND and be playing in current year of graduation. Must submit a personal letter indicating any other contributions made to the hockey community such as a coach, on-ice helper, referee, shadow program, or volunteer. Must have a letter from current hockey coach indicating strengths. Must have proof of acceptance into post-secondary. No grade level standards are required. University, college, trade, or technical institutions accepted.

North Delta Rotary -	\$1000	Awarded to student with good academic standing volunteered in school or community activities and is continuing post-secondary education.
	\$1000 (Trades)	Awarded to students committed to pursuing careers in the trades.Preference will be given to applicants who are committed to careers in the trades as evidenced by proof of acceptance into a full-time trades program at a registered B.C.post secondary institution.Evidence of Community service and demonstrated financial need will also be considered when selecting the successful award recipients.
Ravi Kahlon North Delta Community Scholarship	\$500	A deserving grade 12 student who supports social justice and democratic ideals, enrolled in a post- secondary institution, and involved in volunteer work in the community or school that aims to create progressive change.
Sunshine Hills Tennis Club -	\$250	A deserving graduating student who is presently a resident of North Delta and continuing on to a post- secondary institution. A student who demonstrates sport development through officiating or coaching, preferably at the community level and/or at the school level.
Southpoint Electric Scholarship	\$500 x 2	Awarded to a graduate in good academic standing who is pursuing a career in the trades. (Must provide proof of acceptance to a Foundation program or enrolment with the ITA to claim scholarship)
Canuel Caterers -	\$200x1	Awarded to a graduate continuing his/her post- secondary education in the culinary arts or business program.
Compass/Canteen (Formerly Vendmaster)	\$200	Awarded to a graduate continuing his/her post- secondary education in the culinary arts or Business program.
